
How to Attach Wire to Your Artwork



It's important That you properly prepare your artwork for hanging in AAIE's upcoming juried art show. Please read and follow the instructions carefully. If not done correctly, your artwork could be rejected.

- 1. MEASURE THE DISTANCE DOWN THE SIDE OF THE WORK AND DIVIDE BY 4. MARK 1/4 OF THE DISTANCE FROM THE TOP, INSIDE THE WOOD FRAME.
- 2. PUSH A NAIL INTO THE MARK TO START THE HOLE FOR THE EYE SCREW. WAX THE THREADS OF THE EYE SCREW SO IT WILL SCREW IN EASILY. DO THIS ON BOTH SIDES OF THE FRAME. PLACING THE EYE SCREWS ON THE INSIDE OF THE FRAME WILL HELP PREVENT DAMAGE WHEN THE ARTWORK IS STACKED.
- 3. THREAD THE WIRE THROUGH THE EYE ABOUT 2 INCHES, AND TWIST THE END AROUND THE MAIN WIRE UNTIL IT IS SECURE.
- 4. MEASURE 4 INCHES FROM THE TOP CENTER OF THE FRAME, AND MARK WHERE THE WIRE WILL HANG ON THE HOOK OR NAIL. PLACE THE LOOSE END OF THE WIRE THROUGH THE OTHER EYE SCREW, AND PULL THE WIRE TO THE HANGING MARK. CUT THE REMAINING WIRE TO ABOUT 2 INCHES AND TWIST SECURELY AROUND THE MAIN WIRE UNTIL SECURE.
- 5. IF DESIRED, PLACE TAPE AROUND THE TWISTED WIRE FOR EXTRA SECURITY AND TO PREVENT INJURY.
